CALL FOR PAPERS

Industry 4.0—also called the Fourth Industrial Revolution or 4IR presents a social-political and economic shift from the digital age of the early 2000 to an economic era of complex connectivity characterised by rapid and ubiquitous advancement in technology that clearly alters the way people perceive, experience and react to happenings in the world around them. The 4IR proposes that humans have created and become submerged in a digitally complex and augmented social-economic reality that has impacted the natural senses and industrial ability of humans alone.

In other words, the Fourth Industrial Revolution is the current and developing environment in which digital technologies trend towards automation and data exchange in manufacturing technologies and processes, Cyber Physical Systems (CPS), Industrial Internet of Things (IoT), Cloud Computing, Cognitive Computing, robotics, virtual reality (VR) and Artificial Intelligence (AI) – which are changing the way modern people live and work. How do we interrogate these and other forces that have continued to re-shape or redefine twenty-first century studies in the arts and humanities in Africa? What intellectual debate, discussions and exchanges have evolved in the engagement of researchers and scholars with these forces? This conference will focus on these as well as exploring the issues of underdevelopment in Africa and the role of the arts and humanities in addressing them. Participants are therefore, expected to illuminate the researches and methodologies that have emerged on how the arts and humanities can contribute to new understandings of latest trends towards the Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR) in Africa.
